

Last Wednesday saw the loss of Houston artist Ayn X Morgan. A frequent and devoted visitor to the Menil all her adult life, she was a Symbolist who reveled in the intellectual nuance of collage. During her short time a plethora of creative enterprises

benefited from her contributions to the fields of set & fashion design, oral history, restoration, archiving, photography, copy-editing, graphic & web design, painting, audio production, horticulture, and refinishing.

For years, Ayn's radio show The Chestnut Tree on KTRU and then KPFT was the only representation of experimental audio on the local FM dial. She made a point of supporting emerging artists in Houston and earned the respect of the sonic avantgarde around the world.

The textures, patterns, and forms in the items around us led to her many collections, ranging from Victorian-era antiques to found objects. Shy and passionately independent, Ayn Morgan showed everyone she encountered a definitive example of politeness and social sensitivity.

Family and close friends will gather to celebrate her life and art on Tuesday, September 29, 2015 from two o'clock until five o'clock in the afternoon at the Bradshaw Carter Home, 1734 West Alabama Street, Houston, TX 77098.


